HISTORY OF NAVARRO COLLEGE

Navarro College was founded in 1946 by a group of local citizens committed to furthering the educational opportunities of the local community. The first students began classes in September of that year, on the site of the former Air Activities of Texas Flight School located six miles south of Corsicana.

In 1951, the campus was moved to its present location, which currently includes 117 acres, 13 academic buildings, and 24 student housing units.

In an attempt to address the growing needs of its service area, which consists of Navarro, Ellis, Freestone, Limestone, and Leon counties, the College began offering courses in these counties and eventually established the following permanent locations: Navarro College Mexia, located in Limestone County, Navarro College Waxahachie, and Navarro College Midlothian, both located in Ellis County.

Navarro College has had eight presidents: Mr. Ray Waller, the founding president served until his death in 1956; Dr. Ben W. Jones served from 1956 until 1973; Dr. Kenneth P. Walker served from 1974 until 1988; Dr. Gerald E. Burson served from 1989 until his retirement in January 1998; Dr. Richard Sanchez served from 1998 until his first retirement in 2013 and returned again from 2016 - 2018; Dr. Barbara Kavalier served from 2013 until 2016; and Dr. Kevin G. Fegan, the current District President, began his service in September 2018.

HISTORY OF THE ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM AT NAVARRO COLLEGE

Navarro College first opened its doors to Adult Education students in August of 1986. All instruction offered in the program is accredited by the Texas Workforce Commission. The Program is designed to serve adults in Ellis, Kaufman, Navarro and Rockwall Counties. Instruction is available in basic reading, writing, and math skills; TxCHSE preparation; English as a Second Language; U.S. Citizenship exam preparation, College and Career Transition, and basic literacy. Adults enroll to seek employment, to advance on the job, to pursue a college education, or for personal enrichment.

HISTORY OF THE CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAM AT NAVARRO COLLEGE

For over 75 years, Navarro College has been opening doors for non-degree seeking students looking for professional and personal growth. We offer career skills training for adults who are not seeking a degree but want to pursue career advancement, opportunities for transitioning to new careers, or reaching their lifelong learning goals.
