FLEXIBILITY – Day classes are offered fall, spring, and summer semesters.

COLLEGE CREDIT – All EMT classes are credit classes and students finish with six (6) credit hours. Credit hours can give graduates an advantage when searching for employment.

DEGREE – EMT Certificate hours apply to the AAS Paramedic Degree.

REQUIRED COURSES –

Clinical – Emergency Medical Technician – EMSP 1160

TUITION - \$1,400 (approximately) – Tuition is based on out-of-district rates. If you live in-district (Navarro County) tuition may be less. Malpractice Insurance included.

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APPLICATION PROCESS

1ST STEP: Procedures for Admission to Navarro College

- Fill out application for admission to Navarro College at ApplyTexas on the [Navarro College.edu](http://NavarroCollege.edu) website.
- Submit OFFICIAL High School or College transcripts to the registrar's office.
- Submit Bacterial Meningitis Immunization paperwork to the registrar's office.
- Schedule and complete TSI Assessment test. (unless exempt)

2ND STEP: Registration for EMT Program

Registration must be completed with the EMS Department through the Academic Advisors on the Waxahachie Campus. Students are encouraged to frequently contact their Academic Advisors for progress in the registration process.

- CPR card is required by 1st day of class.

CURRENT IMMUNIZATIONS

- Hepatitis B - Complete series of three or Positive Titer**
- Tuberculosis Test - blood test required yearly or inquire about skin test
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella - Series of two immunizations needed or Positive Titer**
- Varicella – Two immunizations or Positive Titer**
- TDAP – immunization must be current within 5 years
- Influenza - Current season immunization for Fall and Spring Classes
Info required: name, date, lot number, site of injection, signature of person administering the vaccine
- Medical Release – Form is included in the registration packet

**Titers to include IgG Lab value and interpretation key

DRUG SCREEN / BACKGROUND CHECK

Students must purchase an account with CastleBranch (outside entity), which includes your background check and immunization compliance tracker. Drug Screening occurs after courses have begun. Non-compliance with either may result in student being dropped.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

A Social Security number is required for EMS clinical course requirements.

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
